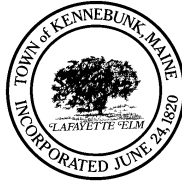

Connect with Town Manager, Department of Public Works, Energy Efficiency Committee, CET, Un. Of S. Maine Mitchell Center for Sustainability when requested to collect information for composting initiatives

- Travel to communities that compost for advice about running local composting

sites, and/or contracting composting assistance, and about averting problems with the process or even about union issues

- Converse with Hannaford about their recent changing composting initiatives
- Contact Shelly Pingree about federal and local legislation re. food waste
- Learn what sites and processes are legal with the DEP and other state governance
- Determine whether volunteer work at a composting site is feasible
- Organize a visit by Mark King to inform town about state initiatives and community successes
- Research collection/ transport options and costs
- Research cost and/or savings from other communities that compost
- Look for additional funding possibilities beyond DEP grants
- Look at methane sequestration's best practices to inform Kennebunk about savings
- Research what town employee labor might cost
- Research town property, landscape companies, and local farms for composting sites
- Work with representatives of the Hospitality/ Food Service Industry to identify a sustainable and environmentally responsible task line (from planning, purchasing, preparation, service, to clean up) with a goal of reducing overall waste while positively impacting the financial bottom line.
