A single use plastic bag is a bag provided at the point of sale for the purpose of transporting food/merchandise out of the establishment. It **DOES NOT** include produce bags (those bags used to hold meats or produce to prevent these items from coming into contact with other purchases) or bags provided by pharmacies to hold prescription drugs.

In order to keep administrative reporting costs from becoming complicated, costly, and onerous to both town management and the retailer, the bag fees would be retained by the retailer to use for any legal purpose.
