On the Municipal Ballot residents will be voting on the following Zoning items:

- ♦ Article 10, Section 17—to amend the restriction regarding cooking facilities within Hotels, Motels and Inns.

- ♦ Article 10, Section 23—to add a new performance standard called Design Review which shall apply to new development occurring in the commercial zones along the Portland Road and York Street corridors and Article 8, Sections 8, 11 and 13—to amend related permitted use listing regarding eating places that permit drive-through windows.

THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE
would like to announce that you can now pay your Personal Property Tax/Real Estate Tax Bill online!

The Town has partnered with the State of Maine and Maine PayPort Online to offer this third party service. Fees apply for any payments made using this service. A \$1.00 fee will be charged for payments totaling \$40.00 or less and a 2.5% fee will be charged for payments over \$40.00.

Before getting started you will need the following:

- * Account Number
- * Property address, including zip code
- * Payment Amount

You can also *drop off your payment in the secure lock-box* the town has provided on the ground level entry lobby of the Town Hall.

The Town is once again offering this one day drop off for unwanted, unused household items that are considered Hazardous Waste. DOG LICENSES expire annually on Dec. 31st.



2014 Licenses will be available starting Nov. 12th and can be done online, by mail or in person. Information on how to license your dog can be found on the Town's website under Departments, Town Clerk. Fees are set by the state at \$6 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$11 for all other dogs.

Beginning on Feb. 1, 2014 a \$25 late fee will be assessed per dog.
